NEW YORK (UP) The prospects are that still more radio programs will be turned into television versions as the months roll by. CBS has been delving into the subject, particularly Hollywood, and has come up with a plan to group four of its successful comedy skits into a monthly cycle.

The programs are My Friend Irma, Our Miss Brooks, My Favorite Husband and Life With Luigi. The intention is to use the radio personalities who ever practicable. Produced in Hollywood, they would be film recorded and aired under a schedule that would give the quartet the same spot each week, the programs running in sequence.

Other CBS television projects call for a video version of the Corliss Archer stories this summer, another one for the Hal Peary Show (He's ex-Gilder sleeve) and finally the appearance of Joan Davis in regular TV. Also a George Raft specialty made TV film, the Rocky Jordan adventure story, is in the works as a proposed video Mr. and Mrs. skit by Lucille Ball and her husband, Desi Arnaz. If that materializes, Lucille will not participate in the TV My Favorite Husband as she does in the radio series.
