## No Concerts by Toscanini

NEW YORK. (AP) Going off the air two weeks ahead of schedule on order of his physician, Arturo Toscanini, approaching his 84th year, will present later day French, British and Italian compositions in his last concert tomorrow evening. The program runs an hour at the usual time on N. B. C.

Actually, Toscanini's doctor wanted him to forego even this program, but the conductor insisted. He has been advised to take a complete rest to insure proper attention to an injured knee. It has been troubling him considerably since a fall in his home some time ago and has not mended as had been anticipated. He plans to spend the next two weeks in Philadelphia for further treatment.

The concluding concert comes only four weeks after his delayed return to the air on January 27. At his request the usual studio audiences have been eliminated in the series save for the first one, which was a benefit with paid admissions.

Guest conductors and guest soloists will take over the two remaining programs in the current cycle. Bruno Walter to direct next week.

Toscanini indicated the keenest regret at being unable to finish the season as he had planned, but if his health permits he has hopes of being able to resume in the fall. Aside from the knee, his health and energy are the same as ever.

March 25 will be his next birthday.

**'No Meat' Club Makes Wires Hum**

SWEETWATER, Texas, Feb. 16. (AP) Housewife members of a "no meat" club kept telephone wires humming today as they asked other women to join them in a buyers' strike to bring down meat prices.

Members of the club agreed not to buy meat for a week.

"The government isn't going to do anything about high prices," said Mrs. W. E. Kirkpatrick, "but housewives can curb prices by stopping buying."

Mrs. Kirkpatrick, Mrs. G. A. Adams and Mrs. Dudley Wilson said they hoped the idea spread to other towns.

## Philco Unveils War-time Model Television Set

WASHINGTON, Feb. 16. (AP) Philco Corp. has unveiled a new type television set designed to prove there can be a war emergency and plenty of new TV receivers, too.

The company demonstrated for newsmen a "performance-conservation" model which eliminates or makes only a minimum use of strategic materials whose use is restricted.

The set, for which William Calderston, Philco president, claimed performance superior to receivers now on the market, was shown to government officials and representatives of the armed forces.

Philco calls it an answer to public apprehension that set production will have to be curtailed. Calderston said in a statement Philco's new model eliminates entirely the use of ultrascarc cobalt and reduces the amount of aluminum required in a set by 68 per cent, coupled with reductions of 58 per cent in silicon steel, 51 per cent in ferrite, 28 per cent in copper and 15 per cent nickel.

Company officials said prices of the models will be approximately the same as sets of the same tube size now on the market.

Philco said the new set represents the results of two years of engineering research undertaken in an effort to simplify receiver design.

Balderston said the new design has been exhaustively field-tested in numerous notoriously poor television reception areas and that it consistently outperforms all other television receivers in the same areas.

Company officials said they hope to have it in full production by April.

## AEC Tightens Security Ring

OAK RIDGE, Tenn., Feb. 16. (AP) The Atomic Energy Commission said today it is tightening its security ring around the three atomic plants here.

The commission, among other things, has increased its security patrol force and also the number of guards working with AEC contractors. It has clamped down on visitors to restricted areas where the plants are situated.
