Bill Doukna's SPOTLIGHT Jean Casadesus

TIP O' THE MORNING: Dick Jurgens' band will be at Riverview ballroom, Sauk City, for an Easter Monday dance.

An audience which overflowed from the Wisconsin Union theater into their Memorial Union rooms heard Jean Casadesus, pianist, in his first Madison recital Sunday afternoon.

The theater was filled well before program time, and about 200 persons were turned away. Many went to spots in the building which were connected to the stage by public address system.

Under Prof. Richard C. Church, the students gave Casadesus a sound backing for the Liszt E-flat concerto, a stimulating and brilliant work in which the pianist showed himself in easy and unpretentious player, thoroughly versed in his technical aspects.

More than that, he played with such attention to the diversities of the concerto's movements that their individuality was easily noted, despite the Liszt innovation of tying them together with the effect of a single movement.
