Waukesha Orchestra: The Waukesha Symphony Orchestra—literally a people's orchestra—comes in for publicity and praise in the current issue of Holiday magazine, which goes on sale today. "Waukesha," says the article, "is probably the smallest city in the U. S. with a full-scale symphony playing a full, five-concert season." Holiday calls it a "people's orchestra" because (like the Madison Civic Symphony orchestra) a good half of the 90-odd musicians are amateurs—housewives, students, and workmen. The orchestra is "astonishingly good," says the magazine, under the leadership of Milton Weber, young Austrian-born conductor. Deems Taylor's choice of the 10 finest orchestras in the land and a "dream orchestra" of the best first-desk musicians also are in the magazine. Taylor lists the Boston Symphony, New York Philharmonic, Cincinnati Symphony, Chicago Symphony, Cleveland, Indianapolis Symphony, Minneapolis Symphony, St. Louis Symphony, and San Francisco Symphony orchestras.
