Auxiliary to Alcoholics Anonymous Plans Sixth Anniversary Program for Sunday

HERE in Long Beach there is a group of gallant women who have known grief and despair, but because of their faith and courage, they have banded together with the unselfish motive of helping each other over a rugged path.

For reasons which are obvious, not necessary. Their unselfish names of auxiliary members loyalty and devotion is their own are not used here. Names are shining banner.

They have chosen the name Autonomous Auxiliary, and they are the women whose menfolk are members of Alcoholics Anonymous. Their aim is to readjust their lives and give whole-hearted aid to those in their families who are fighting to overcome the alcohol habit. They are not essentially a temperance group; neither are they reformers. But the problem of each member is almost identical, wherefore they meet on common ground and do not rail at fate. They simply meet and overcome each obstacle through the basic AA formula of helping each other.

On Sunday the local group of auxiliary members and units from surrounding harbor area towns will meet from 8 to 9:30 p. m. in Concert Hall, Municipal Auditorium. A program has been arranged. There will be speakers from Long Beach and other cities.

The meeting and program is designed as an observance of the sixth anniversary of the founding of the auxiliary group in the harbor area.

In the preamble of the auxiliary's constitution these significant words are included: "As wives and husbands of Alcoholics Anonymous, we would like you to feel that we understand as perhaps few can . . . we feel that no situation is too difficult and no unhappiness too great to overcome."

Farther along in the preamble these words leap from the printed page: "We thought, on the whole, that we were pretty good people, capable of being nicer if our alcoholic stopped drinking. But it was a silly idea that we were too good to need God."

They make no effort to dramatize their gallant work. But here in our own city this organization, by its own gallantry and courage, brings hope and faith into lives that once were dreary and without hope.

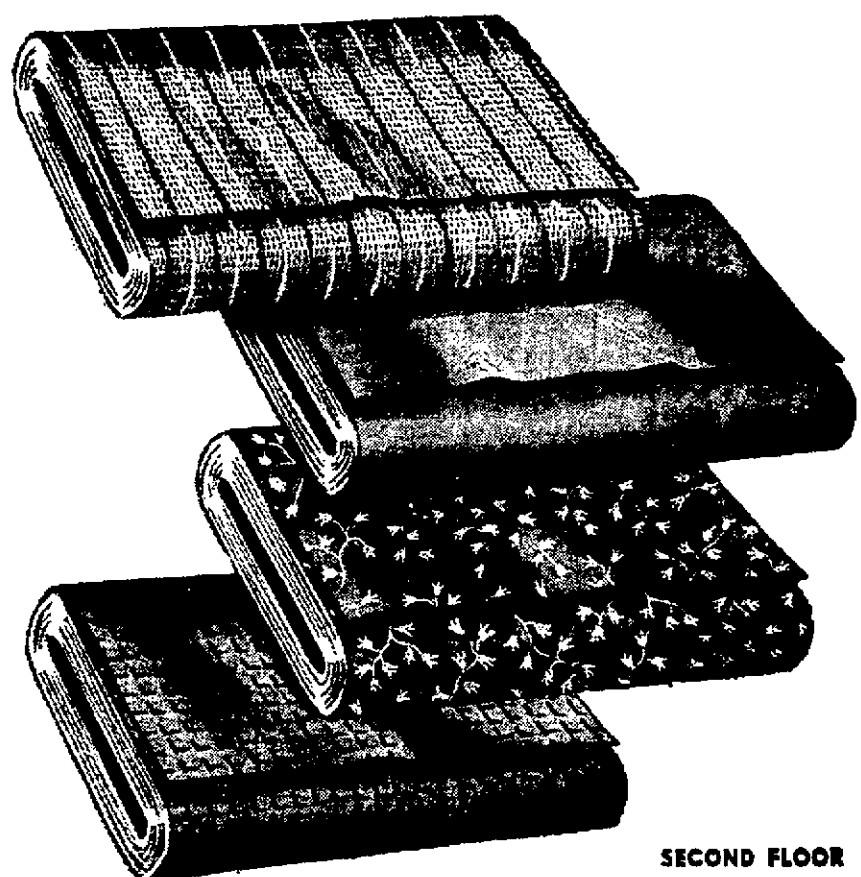
