Seek to Measure Layer Guarding Earth From Sun

WASHINGTON, March 8. (AP) The Smithsonian Institution is testing new equipment which may measure accurately the thin ozone layer protecting the Earth from the sun's deadly ultra-violet rays.

The equipment is being tested in the institution's astrophysical observatory on Table Mountain, Calif., a spokesman said. It is designed to measure the amount of a single narrow wave band of infra-red light which cuts through the ozone to the Earth.

The ozone is a type of oxygen formed in a "blanket" about 15 miles above the surface of the Earth by the sun's ultra-violet light acting on molecules of ordinary atmospheric oxygen.

This thin layer—estimated to be about two or three millimeters thick—absorbs most of the ultra-violet light of the sun, including rays which are deadly to life.

Current methods of measuring the layer's thickness depend on computing the amount of ultra-violet light penetrating the ozone and noting changes in visible light which it produces.
