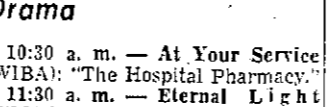
Sunday's Crossword Puzzle

Crossword puzzle grid with numbers and a list of words to be placed in the grid.

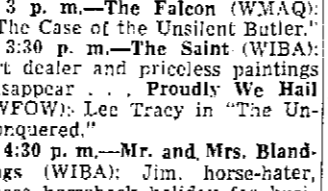

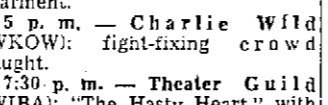
