


Fix It Yourself

Women have the same idea about the colors of the paint for walls and ceilings as they do about hats—it's better to buy different ones from matching sets. That makes the job of getting the right color and shade paint sort of difficult. Professional painters have their own particular way of solving this problem but the amateur painter does not have these advantages.

The simplest solution to the problem of matching color and paint shades is to take yourselves down to a paint store that specializes in making up color combinations. These concerns have color charts with samples of every conceivable color and shade. Once the right combination has been found, the necessary quantity of paint is mixed up and you're all set to go. Most of these paint stores charge only a very reasonable price for these individually mixed paints but some are way out of line on check on the price per quart or gallon before you have the stuff mixed up. Also, order a sufficient quantity for the entire job so you won't have to go back for an extra half pint or so.

Another way to match colors is to get ready-mixed paint of the approximate color and shade and then add color-in-oil of the colors you think will produce exactly what you want. This calls for a little experimenting on your part but be sure to write down the exact amount of each color-in-oil that you add so that when you get the right shade and color you'll know exactly how to mix up the next batch.
