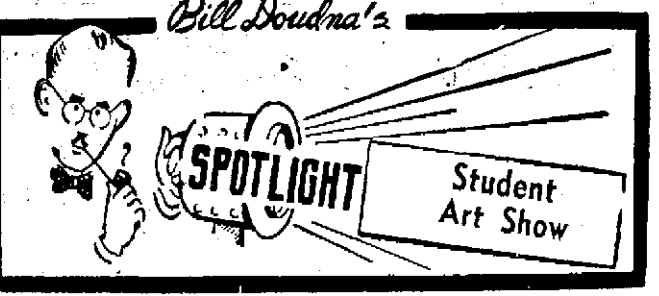

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Safety, Food Meetings to Be Held Here Apr. 5-6

The annual Safety Institute and Food Technology conference, held in the past in Milwaukee, will be held in Madison Apr. 5-6.

The safety institute will be held at the Hotel Lorraine.

Babcock hall on the University of Wisconsin campus will be the scene of the food technology meeting.

Sponsors of the annual conference are the Wisconsin Cannerymen's assn., the Wisconsin Industrial Commission, and the Wisconsin Council of Safety.

Two of the safety meeting speakers will be Dr. L. E. Drake, university student counseling center director, who will tell how to get the real facts of an accident through interviews, and John H.
