### Networks Busy Planning Replacements for Summer

AMBITIOUS writers and radio-TV hopefuls, should start getting their scripts and show ideas into the hands of the various station and network program directors, as the summer replacement shows are now under consideration.

Taking CBS as an example, here are some of the shows and show ideas that are to be auditioned or are on the shelf for consideration by this network:

(1) A script is on file, written by Artie Slander, titled "The Things You Hear at Mike's." Pat O'Brien has been approached to star in this, but there is nothing definite set. (2) "Great Grandfather," a dramatic idea, is on hand, but the exact format is not known. (3) "All About Ann" is a dramatic situation comedy series being considered, which would star Barbara Whiting and Gale Gordon of CBS' "Mr. Jinks" fame, now off the air. (4) "Meet Millie," written by Frank Gale, a CBS staff producer, is beyond the consideration point, and is in the process of being cast. This one also is a dramatic situation comedy type show. (5) There is a dicker going on to star Howard Duff (ex-"Sam Spade") in a new show idea titled "The McCoy," a melodrama series.

Summer replacement shows on the networks usually have been considered a proving ground for possible permanency. Many have taken their stand as top rate permanent shows, and many new talents as writers, producers and actors have been discovered as a result of these shows.

## Film Merger Is Consumated

HOLLYWOOD, April 12. (AP) United Artists, Inc., will take over Eagle-Lion Classics, distribution company for independent film productions, on April 23.

Leon Kaplan, general California counsel for Pathe Industries, Inc., and its subsidiaries, announced last night that the merger has been consummated in New York.

The transaction was reported to involve about \$5,000,000, of which \$1,500,000 was said to be in cash.

Kaplan emphasized that the deal does not involve Eagle-Lion Studios, Pathe Industries, Inc., or Pathe Laboratories of New York and California.
