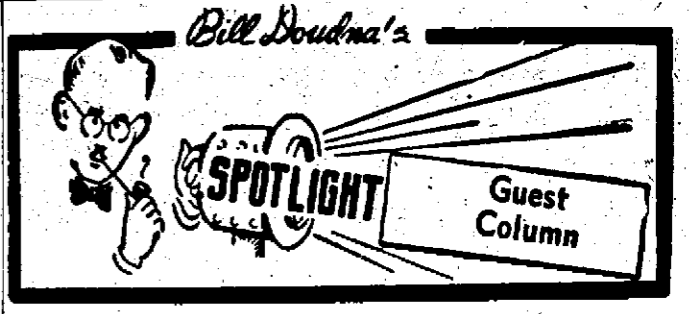

Forty water colors of American birds by Louis Agassiz Fuertes are on public view through Apr. 22 at Scanlan hall of the Vocational school. These originals have great beauty; they represent the culmination of achievement in the field of bird artistry.

Alexander Wilson was the first of the great trilogy of bird illustrators. He holds an honorable place. But the towering Audubon quickly surpassed him from the points of view of coloration and structural accuracy. Throughout the rest of the 19th century he wore the crown; and, as we know, even today his name tends to overshadow all others.

Time will show, however, that he must yield precedence to Fuertes, whose craftsmanship and artistry were greater than his. For Audubon's drawing sometimes falls him; sometimes there is a woodman's over-enthusiasm, sometimes an over-soft curvature of line; sometimes the coloration is faulty; sometimes there is something of strain.

The crown must pass to Fuertes, and doubtless for the following reasons: The most important of these is that he was born an artist and further endowed with the gifts of unremitting industry and the kind of absorbed concentration Ruskin had. Even in his middle teens he gained recognition, among the discerning, for potential greatness.

Furthermore, he had the kind of photographic mind that retains details far beyond the powers of the average observer. All these facilities add up to a great deal. But he had something higher than all of them. He loved the birds he painted, and through this love and the perfect mastery of his craft he gives us the personality, the earnestness, the souls of the birds he put on his canvases.

He is the master of all artists in ornithology. (Editor's Note: Prof. Taylor was a friend of Fuertes, and talked of his work at the opening of the exhibition last Sunday.)
