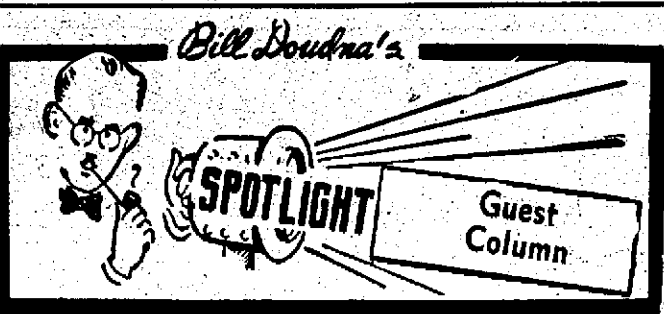

People with gallery-going habits continually see, and enjoy paintings, but it is an unusual experience to be startled by the vigor and power of a roomful of pictures.
