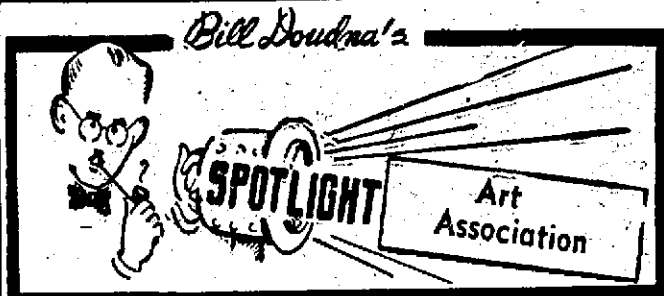

A history of the Madison Art Assn., compiled by Mrs. Walter Elja, will be presented at the 50th anniversary banquet of the Madison Art Assn., to be held Tuesday, May 1, in Greathall of the Memorial Union.

"This promises to be a gala affair," said Mrs. R. J. Koltos, association president, in her annual report mailed to members this week. "With a minimum of business, the emphasis this year will be on the celebration of the association's 50th birthday."

Still ahead, on the 1950-51 calendar are the annual Salon of School art, May 13 through June; an exhibition of ceramics by Prof. F. Carlton Ball, decorated by Aaron Bohrod, May 17-26, and the awarding of summer scholarships to pupils in the eighth and ninth grades of Madison schools.

Three board members will retire: They are Mrs. William W. Howells, social chairman; Frederick L. Carpenter, gallery chairman, and Mrs. Donald J. Reppen. Membership is 917. Chairman Emily D. Erickson of the membership committee reported.

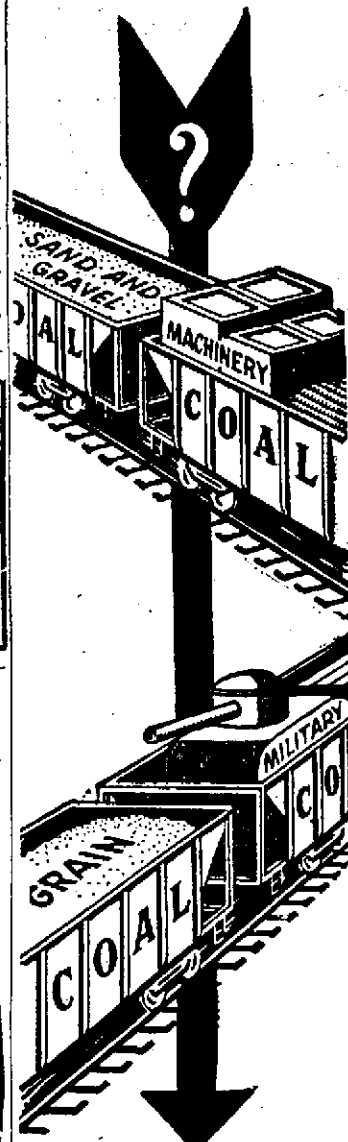
