This is headache week once more in the radio department, with New York, Chicago, and other broadcasting centers going on daylight time for the

summer. Radio's progress makes the headaches grow smaller, however. Use of recording equipment coupled with setups

of special circuits means that stations in standard time zones will make very few changes in their

schedules. It works like this:

Network shows are carried into such cities as Chicago, where they are recorded. Then the network engineers hold the tapes or records for an hour, and put them on special sixth statements. cial circuits to standard time zones.

Living in such a zone gives listeners one advantage—they usually have two chances to hear a favorite program. For example, on Wednesday you can hear "The Halls of Ivy" on WMAQ at 6 p. m., but if you miss it you can still pick it up at 7 on WIBA and

One exception will be "Stop the Music," which will be heard at the same time everywhere—6 p. m. Sunday, central standard time. Its Madison outlets are WISC and WISC-FM.



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
