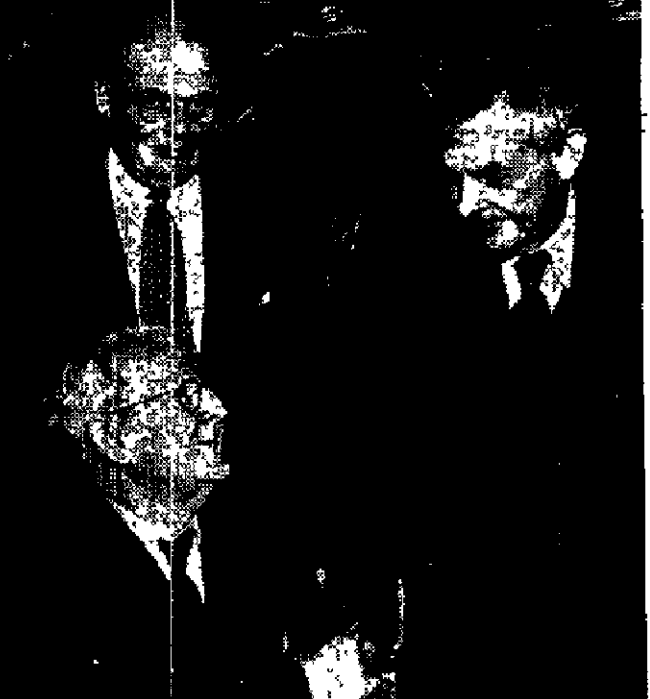

Tom O'Neil Named Top MBS Director

By ROCKY CLARK 'Scarcely five years ago, young Thomas F. O'Neil, fresh out of the Navy, came to Bridgeport to learn the broadcasting business under the tutelage of Joe Lopez, then manager of WICC. Today, in New York, the same young Mr. O'Neil was elected chairman of the board of directors of the Mutual Broadcasting System.

Young O'Neil only stayed in Bridgeport a couple of weeks when he first came here to work with Lopez. It was his first stop on the road that has taken him rapidly toward the destination he reached today as top man of one of the nation's four major networks.

O'Neil got into radio after the General Tire and Rubber company purchased the Yankee Network, of which WICC is a subsidiary. Tom is vice-president and director of General Tire. From Bridgeport he went to the Yankee Network's headquarters in Boston where he rapidly learned the ropes and soon began reorganizing the operations, effecting economies and putting his own business ideas to work.

Recently, he effected a merger between Yankee and the big Don Lee network on the west coast and today, as vice-president and director of the combined Don Lee-Yankee networks, he was elected to succeed Theodor C. Steinberg, president of WOR, as Mutual's board director.

E. M. Antrim, secretary of Chicago's WGN, was named vice-chairman of the Mutual board, a position previously held by O'Neil. James E. Wallen took over Antrim's former position of secretary, combining that office with his previous one as treasurer. All other board members were re-elected, including Mutual's president, Frank White.

PROGRAMS OFF THE AIR

SAN FRANCISCO, April 30—(AP) Radio broadcasts of three major networks to and from the east coast and news-wire service in California were interrupted last night for approximately half an hour.

A blown fuse in a Pacific Telephone and Telegraph repeater station at Bakersfield, Calif., was blamed. The fuse blew at 5:50 p. m. (PT) (7:50 p. m. EST) and was replaced at 7:17 p. m. (EDT) but services to the networks and news services was restored earlier by substituting other lines.
