



3 egg yolks 1 teaspoon vanilla 9-inch baked pastry shell (made with pie crust mix) 3 to 4 ripe bananas (depending

1. Scald 134 cups milk with corn syrup in top of double boiler. 2. Blend cornstarch with remaining 1/4 cup milk; add sugar, salt. 3. Add egg yolks to cornstarch mixture, beat until well blended.

4. Add a little hot milk mixture to egg mixture, then add to remaining hot milk mixture.

5. Stir over hot water until thickened; cover; cook 7 minutes. 6. Remove from heat; add vanilla; cool.

7. Cover bottom of pie shell with thinly sliced bananas.

8. Add cornstarch filling; top with another layer of bananas. Cover with meringue made with egg whites or whipped cream as preferred. Garnish with fluted banana slices if desired.


