Yesterday we showed how to bid with a hand that is too strong for one no-trump but too weak for two no-trump.
You bid one of a suit and then jump in no-trump at your second turn.
Today we show the exception to that rule.
If South responds with one of a suit, North jumps to two no-trump. When South makes the weak response of one no-trump, North raises to two no-trump.
Not that this raise shows a very strong hand, North knows that South has very little, but he is still willing to invite a game. This takes real power.
South has a trifle more than might be expected, so he accepts the invitation.
He knows that North has roughly twice the value of an average hand. This is just right, for North actually does have two ace, two
