Bill Doudna's SPOTLIGHT 'Goodbye, My Fancy' Calendar Entertainment

TIP O' THE MORNING: "Quiz Kids" will be back on NBC-WIBA at 6 p. m. Sunday.

Fresh, sparkling comedy, played knowingly and with zest, opened the last week of Wisconsin players' current season Tuesday night in the Wisconsin Union theater.

"Like 'The Male Animal,' which opened the season, this play—'Goodbye, My Fancy'—was laid on a college campus and included rather forceful arguments for faculty freedom from the dictates of business-minded trustees.

Frederick Buerki, who directed the comedy, had chosen his cast wisely. Constance Crosby, Virginia Wright, and Donald Soule were outstanding among the leading players.

"Goodbye, My Fancy" tells of a congresswoman who returns to her alma mater (from which she had been expelled for being caught sneaking into her room at 6 a. m.) to receive an honorary degree.

She falls in love all over again with a professor, now the college president, and succeeds in turning him from an academic coward into the sort of man she wants him to be, much to the surprise and consternation of first, the trustees, and second, a Life photographer who is in love with her, too.

Miss Crosby just about stole the show with her picture of the congresswoman's sophisticated, mildly hard-boiled, and secretly sentimental secretary. Given many of the best laughs of the show by author Fay Kanin, she sold all of them with the wisdom and timing of a veteran comedienne.

Miss Wright played the sportswoman-politician with polish and with an interesting build-up of character. At first, her Agatha Reed appeared reserved, uncertain of the reception she would receive, and a little cool to the whole affair. But with the rebirth of her love for the president and her use of trickery to gain her ends, she became a human and fiery woman.

Soule was the photographer, a sharp operator in love and business. Like Miss Crosby, he had a fine sense of comedy and timing. John Hendricks was reserved and a little ill at ease as the president, and Edna Liessmann had some excellent moments as his daughter.

Miss Kosbab was an overwhelming alumnae secretary, preparing for the great event; Miss Nethercutt, a shy professor of sex hygiene trapped by the demon rum; Miss Levy, an eternal co-ed who let her husband think she wasn't running his affairs; and Miss Fein, a riotously funny phy-ed senior.

A good show all around, this production can stand two improvements—better timing and projection of lines by the girl students in the first act, and a less obvious use of her hands by Miss Wright, a habit which seemed to be contagious before the last curtain.

"Goodbye, My Fancy" will be repeated at 8 each night through Saturday.

Musician's Breach of Contract Suit Ordered Retried

A breach of contract suit involving a 75-year-old musician who once played with John Phillips Sousa should be retried again, the state supreme court ruled Tuesday.

Bohumir Kryl, Chicago, director of the Kryl Women's symphony orchestra, was awarded \$1,100 by a jury in Circuit Judge E. M. Duquaine's court last May. Duquaine later ordered a new trial on grounds that he should have allowed certain defense evidence to be admitted.

The supreme court said, "we agree with the trial court that the evidence should be received."

The case came up after Kryl signed a contract with George Mecholson, manager of the Marinette concert series for two appearances. Kryl agreed to play for \$1,000.

Mecholson, however, wrote Kryl that he would have to cancel the concerts because the Marinette musician's union objected to non-union players appearing there. He said he thought Kryl checked with the union before the contract was signed. Mecholson also said he thought Kryl was recommended by George Quall, an Ishpeming, Mich., booking agent.

The disputed evidence which Duquaine said should be the basis of a new trial concerned the union's objections and Quall's part in the case.
