"There was nothing much to the play at three spades. West opened diamonds, and East took two tricks in that suit. East then led the queen of clubs, and they took three tricks in that suit. After that I still had to lose two trump tricks to West. Down 800 points!"

"My partner's first comment was that I ought to have my head examined for bidding three spades. I said he should have bid three hearts right over three diamonds
