

Mix these cookies in a saucepan, pack them in a 3-pound shortening can, ship them safely to a boy or girl in the service! Make the cans gay with a hearts and flowers decal for the girl, a tailored monogram of decal-tape for the boy, Apply a strip of the tape around the top and bottom. Disguise the cover with heavy white paper and seal it all around with adhesive tape. Pack in a carton and mail. Better save some of the cookies for hungry teenagers at home!

OLD FASHIONED MOLASSES COOKIES

- 1 cup shortening 1 1/2 cups molasses
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 4 cups sifted enriched flour 1 1/2 reaspoons sait
- 2 teaspoons soda! 2 teaspoons cinnamon 1 1/2 teaspoons ginger 1/2 teaspoon cloves
- 1. Melt shortening in saucepan large enough for mixing cookies. Add molasses and sugar; mix well.
- 2. Sift together flour, salt, soda and spices. Add 1 cup flour; best in egg. Add remaining flour; blend smooth. Chill, Shape into 1 1/2 -inch aballs.
- 3. Place on cookie sheets 2-inches apart. Bake in moderate oven 350 degrees Fahrenheit, 15 minutes. Raisin-Walnut Cookies: Add I cup each seedless raisins and chopped walnuts adding flour.
