News in Brief

TIP O' THE MORNING: Reports persist that, by fall, most network television shows will be on film, with Hollywood replacing New York as the major production center for TV. Reasons include high costs of live shows, film availability for simultaneous showing across the country.

The pianists will be Marilyn Archer, Susan Jacobs, Ardith Moseman, Douglas Scheve, Patricia Sutter, and Joan Tallafiero. Acting awards for the 1950-51 season of Wisconsin Players shows will be given Saturday night at the organization's banquet in Hotel Loraine. Winners in five classifications have been chosen by reviewers from The State Journal, the Capital Times, and the Daily Cardinal and the plays' directors.

Racine Sheriff Guilty on Tippy Driving Charge
OSHKOSH—(P)—Racine County Sheriff Walter Becker was found guilty of driving under the influence of liquor in Oshkosh county court Monday, fined \$100 and costs and had his driver's license revoked for one year.

Becker is president of the Wisconsin Sheriff's Assn. In a written decision, Municipal Judge S. J. Luchsinger said the court found the testimony of six eyewitnesses of greater weight than other testimony, including that of expert witnesses whom the defense asked hypothetical questions.

Becker was arrested on the charge after his car left County Trunk I near Oshkosh Apr. 5, knocked over a mailbox and became mired on the lawn of a home.

Judge Luchsinger has been hospitalized with a kidney ailment. His decision, dated May 1, was read by acting municipal Judge D. E. McDonald.

Neither Becker nor his counsel was in court. At Milwaukee, Edward McManus, secretary of the association, said that Becker's conviction will be appealed. McManus, who polled association members on setting up a defense fund for Becker, said the money would come from dues paid to the association.
