Bill Douina's SPOTLIGHT Sinfonia and Choir

TIP O' THE MORNING: Don't be surprised if Dean Jagger, who played Brigham Young on the screen, shows up on Broadway in a musical about the great Mormon.

Great music played and sung beautifully by the Madison String Sinfonia and the Milton college choir delighted an audience in West high school Tuesday night.

It was one of the last concerts of a busy season, and left behind it a feeling of great satisfaction.

The Sinfonia is directed by Marie A. Endres and the choir by Bernhardt H. Westlund; they shared the baton in joint numbers. Both had trained their groups to nearly perfect states. The strings played and voices sang with precision.

But instead of the ostentation which too often marks and mars such precision, these conductors placed their emphasis upon grace, smoothness, and fidelity to tone and spirit.

The concert opened with a finely textured playing of Bach's "Prelude in B Minor," and continued with "Mein Jesus," in which the cellos starred. Both were Stokowski arrangements. The first section ended with the allegro from Bach's E-major violin concerto, a group of eight playing the solo part with considerable polish.

Of the chorus' unaccompanied selections, outstanding were a rich performance of "Jesus, Priceless Treasure," a hitting one of Berg's "Brazilian Psalm," and a quiet version of the spiritual "Were You There," sung as an encore.

With the orchestra, the chorus sang Bach's "Cantata No. 150" and "Jesus, Joy of Man's Desiring." In both, the organizations complemented each other with a natural and easy skill.

Other works which pleased the audience and exhibited the expert training of the groups included Randall Thompson's "Howl Ye by the Choir and Fletcher's "Punk Tune and Fiddle Dance," by the orchestra.

Individual performances deserving mention were Kenneth Babcock's and Mary Wahl's incidental solos in "How Fair Is Thy Face" and "Were You There," respectively; Dan Goldsmith's rapid-fire accuracy on the bass in the Bach cantata, and Roger McIvree's trumpet playing in "Jesus, Joy of Man's Desiring."

Rehearsal will be called at 1:30 p. m. with a meeting of the University of Wisconsin Band association and election of officers to follow.

## Ball-Bohrod Exhibit Is Area's First Major Show of Kind

It is unfortunate that the Ball-Bohrod pottery exhibit now to be seen at the Madison Free Library is scheduled to remain so short a time (until May 28) for this showing merits wide attention and attendance from the Madison cultural area.

Its significance is of a dual character—first, it represents a stimulating cooperative venture between two of Wisconsin's foremost artists, F. Carlton Ball and Aaron Bohrod; second, it has introduced the first major showing in this locality of an art form whose combined qualities of the utilitarian and the esthetic make it one of the most satisfying to the appreciative consumer.

In recent years this country has been experiencing an important renaissance in the crafts. We are becoming aware of the importance of the serious and sensitive craftsman in the development of artistic trends and of his part in the coordination of good design with mass production. By introducing the consumer to everyday utilitarian objects of esthetic quality, the craftsman has a great influence on awakening public interest in the more abstracted fields of painting and sculpture.

It is to be regretted sincerely that the university and a community will, in June, lose such a gifted artist and teacher as F. Carlton Ball, who has done so much in his one year here to stimulate genuine appreciation of fine craftsmanship and increase the enjoyment of all of us in art as a way of life.
