LOOKING AND LISTENING

Long Beach Airmen on KTTV Film Saturday Night

THE 452nd Light Bomb Wing Group, made up mostly of Southern California men, will be seen in an exclusive reel filmed at the war front by the KTTV television newsreel war correspondent, "Red Humphries." Saturday night at 9:00 to 9:30 p. m., Channel 11. The 452nd group made news last week when its commander, Brig. Gen. Luther W. Sweetser Jr., was relieved from his post. Many of the men are from Long Beach.

This marks the first special television coverage of a Southern California fighting unit. Characterized by numerous close-ups of these local boys, the film shows the 452nd Bomb Wing in action, with sound-on-film of the briefing before a mission, several feet of film on air combat, and sound-on-film of the interrogation.

In the preparations for the mission, the boys will be seen loading the ships, making engine repairs on field duty, etc.

Brig. Gen. Sweetser, a resident of Glendale, was instrumental in organizing the group and has been active in the Air Force Reserve since 1930. Most of the airmen are reserves.

The KTTV television newsreel is seen Monday through Friday on KTTV three times daily, but due to the special significance of this footage, it was prepared as a separate 30-minute program.

ABC and Theater Firm Will Merge If FCC Approves

NEW YORK, May 24. (AP) A plan for the merger of the American Broadcasting Co. and United Paramount Theaters, Inc., has been announced by heads of both companies.

The merged company will be known as "American Broadcast- ing-Paramount Theaters, Inc." and said a joint statement last night by Edward J. Noble, chairman of the board of ABC, and Leonard H. Goldenson, President of United Paramount.

The plan is subject to approval by the boards of directors and stockholders of both companies and to the approval of the Federal Communications Commission.

ABC said the statement will constitute a division of the resulting company, Robert Kintner, president of ABC, will serve as president of the ABC division and Goldenson will be president of the parent corporation.
