Although Mario Lanza's "Be My Love" is being credited in some quarters with starting the vogue of opera singers recording popular tunes, we feel the credit should go to Mr. 8-zio Pinza's "South Pacific" adventure. Be that as it may, Richard Tucker is the latest to follow the trend, and he does a commendable job for Columbia on "Tell Me", a tuneful ballad authored by crooner Man Dale and a couple of other chaps. Dale has also recorded the tune for Columbia's popular label and the youngsters who prefer his romantic style.

"Faithfully Yours", a Toblas-Rombeig tune, is the plattermate for Am I to Know?" with Ann Blyth Tucker's version, while Dale's com-panion piece is "A Robin and s Rainbow and a Red Red Rose", a Year" on the other side. . . A rather lively ditty. Percy Faith's most unusual novelty is Columbia's orchestra provides accompaniment on both records,

The aforementioned Mr. Pinza and Fran Warren, of all people, are teamed in an RCA-Victor album of tunes from his forthcoming movie, "Mr. Imporium." Fortunate-Miss Warren's harsh voice is present on only two of the six sides in the album, and one of these is a novelty, "My Love and My Mule". which doesn't require too much musical ability. On the other, diamo", she has a comparatively minor role, "Let Me Look at You". "You Belong to My Heart", "Yesterdays" and "September Song" are given beautiful solo performances by the basso of "Met" and "South Pacific" fame.

RCA-Victor deserves a posic for turning out a new album of tunes from "The King and I" which, unless you've seen the show, will prob ably be more acceptable to record huyers than the original cast disc The competent voices of Robert Merrill, Patrice Munsel, Tony Mar tin and Dinah Shore perform "We Kiss in a Shadow", "Shall We Dance", "Something Wonderful", "I Whistle a Happy Tune" and other fine Rodgers and Hammerstein tunes. Columbia has produced the orig-

inal cast recording of "A Tree Grows in Brooklyn", a lively show with few tunes that are ant to score Hit Parade honors. Johnny Johnston handles the main vocal assignment, singing "Growing Pains", "Mine 'Til Monday", "I'm Like a New Broom" and, with Matcia Van Dyke, "Make the Man Love Me," a promising ballad. Shirley Booth provides chuckles aplenty in "Love Is the Reason" and "He Had Refinement," and Derbert Johnson scores nicely with "If You Haven't Got a Sweetheart" with choral backing. Arthur Godfrey does "Love Is the

Reason" on a separate Columbia disc with the Chordettes and Mariners supporting him. On the other side, Laurie Anders joins Godfrey on that Ken Murray "Wide Open Spaces" thing. . . Lisa Kirk does "Love Is the Reason" in a most ac-ceptable fashion for RCA-Victor, with "Sad and Lonely" on the back.

The various recordings of "Old Soldiers Never Die" have a wide assortment of plattermates. Vaughn Monroe's RCA-Victor in a tonguein-cheek country novelty, "Love and Devotion." Gene Autry's Columbia has the flag-waver, "God Bless America." Leroy Holmes' orchestra, an M-G-M, does the catchy British novelty, "I've Got Sixpence." Vaughn Monroe started some


