Stassen in Memorial Day Talk at Arlington Cemetery

MEMORIAL DAY SPECIALS—Memorial Day, 1951, finds several special presentations on both radio and television, with KHJ leading off in the morning with the first lap of the annual Indianapolis Speedway races, starting at 9. At 9:30, KECA will present a special Memorial Day speech by Harold E. Stassen from Arlington National Cemetery, Washington, D. C. Television Station KTTV, Channel 11, takes TV viewers to Inglewood Park Cemetery for special services there at 10, and at 10:30 from KMPC, the Wilshire Christian Church will present a Memorial Day service. Back to the speedway at 10:45 on KHJ for more excitement as the racing cars whiz by, with more air time given to this feature at 12:30 p. m.

Memorial Day usually calls for a baseball doubleheader throughout the country, and Southern California's contribution will be on both radio and television. Starting at 1:25 p. m., KLAC-TV, Channel 13, will telecast the double-header which pits Portland against Los Angeles.

LANZA SINGS—Mario Lanza has been signed to star in a half-hour radio series which will replace the Edgar Bergen-Charles McCarthy Show for the summer months. The 17-week series will originate in the CBS studios in Hollywood, starting June 10. It was announced, Bergen has been resigned by his sponsor for another full season starting in the fall, it was announced simultaneously.

TV Movie Merger Told in Hollywood

HOLLYWOOD. The planned merger of Jerry Fairbanks Productions and Official Films into a television movie organization was disclosed today. The new organization will annually produce hundreds of movies made especially for television, an announcement said today. The Fairbanks Studio, with facilities here and in New York, will continue as the production group while Official will be the sales and distribution arm. A joint statement said \$5,000,000 backing is available for the venture. Listed among stockholders are Jack Benny, Frank Sinatra and Dinah Shore. Negotiations for the merger are now complete, the statement said, adding that the final transaction involving exchange of stock, will take place this week.
