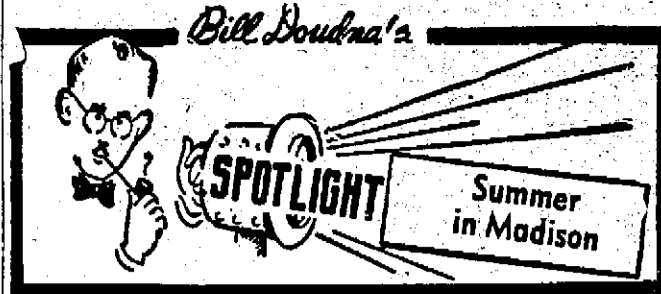

Summer's season of entertainment begins in Madison tonight with the opening of the Junior Chamber of Commerce Rodeo in Penn park. Performances will be at 8 tonight, at 8 p.m. Thursday and Friday, and at 2 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The fourth annual UNICO festival will open today at Olbrich park, and Hennes Brothers shows, one of the larger carnivals, will open Monday at the fairgrounds.

July will bring two circuses—Mills Brothers and Ringling Brothers-Barnum and Bailey. Because music hall will be in the hands of men installing new heating and ventilating (goody-goody) equipment part of the summer, the University of Wisconsin music school has been unable to schedule any concerts there as yet.

However, two musical programs are set elsewhere—the All-State band's concert at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, July 21, and the All-State chorus and orchestra concert Sunday afternoon, Aug. 12. In the field of drama, Wisconsin Players have announced a playbill, consisting of "The Heiress," (July 5-7), "Love's Labour's Lost" (July 19-21), "A Murder Has Been Arranged" (Aug. 2-4), and "Light Up the Sky" (Aug. 8-11) in the Wisconsin Union theater and "The Circle" (July 25-26) in the Play Circle.

DISCS OF THE DAY: On the popular side... Dorothy Kirsten: "Songs of Jerome Kern," with Percy Faith's orchestra. You'll go a long, long time before hearing finer singing of such Kern tunes as "I've Told Every Little Star," "All the Things You Are," "Dear Old Lady," "I've Loved," and others. Percy Faith's orchestral support is superlative. It's a 10-inch LP (Columbia).

Tom Arden: "Little Child," with Paul Weston's orchestra, and "Come Back to Sorrento," with Percy Faith's orchestra — one chorus in Italian (Columbia).

Sara Vaughan: "Deep Purple" and "These Things I Offer You," warm singing with Percy Faith's fine orchestration (Columbia). Art Lund: "I Like the Wide Open Spaces" and "Rose, Rose, I Love You," helped by Three Beaus and a Peep and LeRoy Holmes' orchestra (MGMA). Earl Hines: "Piano Moods," one of the top discs of the current

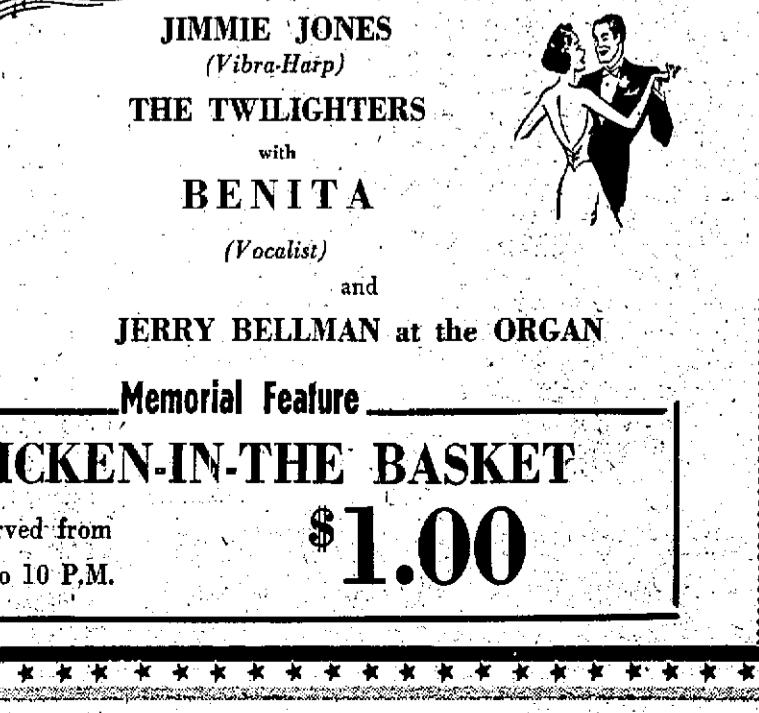
