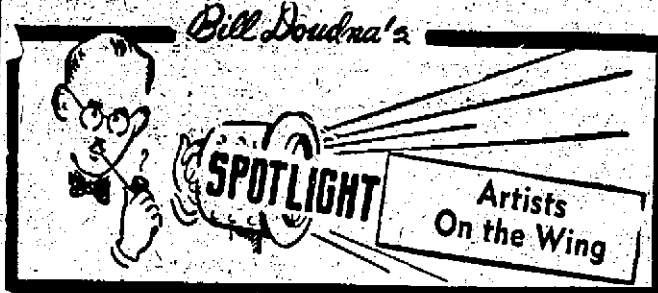

Weather permitting, seven University of Wisconsin artists will fly over eastern Wisconsin tonight on a sketching trip.

Plans called originally for a Friday night flight but this was changed. And the lineup of artists has been altered somewhat, too.

At last word, those boarding the DC-3 here at 6:30 tonight will be Prof. Alfred Sessler, Santos Zingale, Robert Grille, and Dean Meeker of the art education department; Ted Wolf, a graduate student in art history; George O'Connell, graduate student in art education; and Dennis Byng, senior in art education.

ON THE AIR: A portion of today's "Farm News" program on the Columbia network will originate in Madison through WKOW, the CBS affiliate. The program will salute National Dairy Month and in particular, the dairy industry of Wisconsin.

Speaking from Madison will be Gov. Walter Kohler; Milo Swanton, executive secretary of the Wisconsin Council of Agricultural Cooperatives; William Groves, Wisconsin chairman of National Dairy Month; Lyman McKee, president of the Wisconsin branch of the American Dairy assn.; and Donald McDowell, director of the state department of agriculture.

On Thursday, they went with their teacher, Marie Kruse, to the WIBA studios, where they recorded a musical program which will be on the air at 2 p. m. today.

COLOR TELEVISION: Black and white television sets in use now or bought a year from now will have plenty of programs to tune to for five years or more — for longer than their lifetime.

That's the consensus of industry observers as reported by the Associated Press. Some predict a large percentage of television always will be black and white as has been the case with motion pictures.

The Columbia Broadcasting system, whose color method has been adopted as the national standard, has emphasized that it expects the transition to color to take years and to be an orderly process in which nobody's set is made useless before it wears out.

Chairman Wayne Coy of the federal communications commission made the same point before a senate committee holding a hearing on his nomination for a new seven-year term.

Coy said the transition will cover a long period and will be much like the development of black and white television.
