Most Major Video Groups to Ignore Color TV Now

TELEVISION'S fight over color wasn't ended when the Supreme Court upheld the Federal Communications Commission ruling in favor of the CBS System. A week of reaction to the decision makes this very apparent, the Associated Press reports.

Most of the important groups which have opposed the CBS method and supported that of RCA have indicated they do not intend to proceed into color—at least not now. However, a number of smaller companies have expressed readiness to make color-receiving devices, at first mainly adapters and converters.

While the CBS system at present uses a motor-driven color wheel and that of RCA a special tube, the basic difference has been the operating standards. The CBS method is classed as "incompatible" because certain receiver changes must be made even to get the picture in black and white. The RCA is considered "compatible" because its signals are received in black and white on present sets without change. Both systems need a receiver apparatus for color reproduction.

Just how the situation is to evolve into a conclusion satisfactory to both sides is not yet clear. Indications are that color broadcasting, even after it does get started on a regular basis, will be restricted to certain hours because of the necessity of keeping black and white on a full schedule to satisfy the estimated 13,000,000 set owners. Further indications are that the networks outside of CBS are not too anxious to get into color, pending developments.
