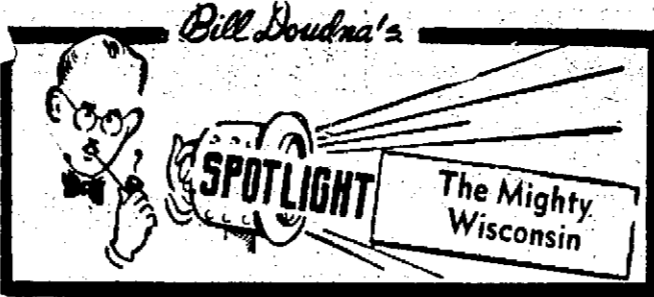

Dakota Judge Calls 2 Executed Nazis 'Very Tough Babies'

BISMARCK, N. D. — (UP) Judge James Morris, chief justice of the state supreme court, said Thursday that two of seven Nazi war criminals executed in Landsberg, prison were "very tough babies."

Judge Morris said he recalled the two men, Oswald Pohl and Otto Ohlendorf, from the period he spent in Germany as one of the Nuremberg war crime trial judges.

The judge said that when Ohlendorf was on the stand as a witness an attorney charged that he was responsible for the deaths of 30,000 persons.

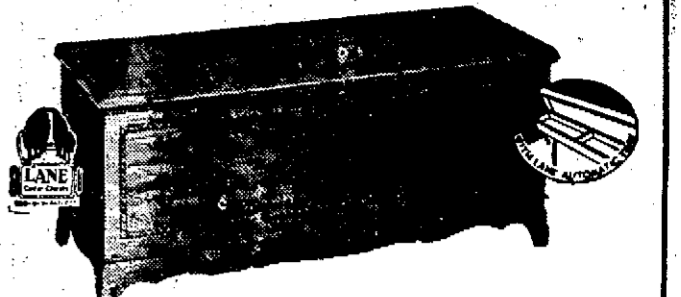
Ohlendorf calmly replied that he considered that estimate too high. He said that 60,000 persons would be more like it.

During the heyday of the Nazis, Ohlendorf was deputy to the Gestapo chief in charge of Nazi extermination units.

Morris was present when another judge pronounced the death sentence on Pohl, chief of staff of the German SS corps. He said that when a sentence was announced, Pohl arrogantly clicked his heels and bowed to the court.
