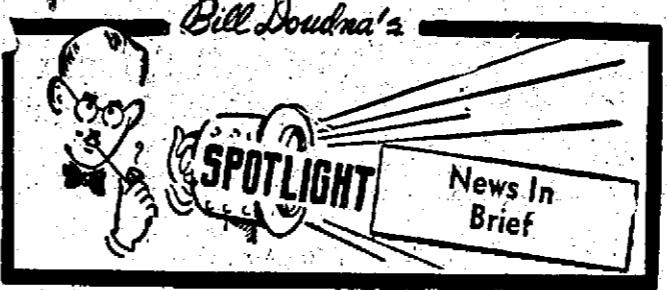

Rice Lake Man Asks OK for TV-Relay Plan

A Rice Lake radio executive asked the State Public Service Commission (PSC) Friday for authority to build a unique master television reception-relay system.

It would be the first of its kind in Wisconsin. Edwin F. Bennett, who plans to pipe TV programs to Rice Lake subscribers, said at a hearing.

Bennett proposes to build a master antenna on a high hill near Rice Lake. The aerial would pick up TV programs originating in Minneapolis and St. Paul. The program would be carried to subscribers' homes by a cable, which would be hung on poles leased from the Wisconsin Telephone Co., he explained.

Monthly charge was set tentatively at \$3.50 for residences and \$5 for business places.

Bennett said he plans to establish a system capable of serving 100 homes. He estimated cost of "his venture would be \$10,000.

Examiner Sam Bryan told Bennett the PSC would take his petition under advisement while it determines whether it or the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has jurisdiction in the matter.
