Experts Predict Price War's End

Says It Hints Inflation Temporarily Stopped

WASHINGTON—(U.P.)—Government economists said Monday New York's price war proved inflation has been stopped temporarily but warned that it does not mean the problem is licked.

The experts explained that the price war was set off by an unusual summer slump in retail business because of big stocks.

Basically, however, the nation's economy is going full blast and price-cutting by a few big department stores is not likely to last for more than a few weeks, the experts predicted.

Expect Rise Again

After the price war ends, they said, the cost of living will remain just as high as it was before and inflation again will be a serious problem.

Economists explained that the price war was set off because production of civilian goods is setting new records. At the same time customers were staying away from stores in unusually large numbers.

Buyers had to be lured back because inventories were getting out of hand.

At the beginning of May, stocks of durable retail goods had increased \$150,000,000 in 30 days, the commerce department estimated. Home furnishing stores accounted for much of this increase.

Manufacturers' inventories rose \$1,900,000,000 during the same period.

Had Money to Spend

Employment and income statistics set new spring records this year so storekeepers knew their customers had money to spend.

The number of workers in May was 61,193,000; unemployment was only 1,609,000, the lowest since the end of World War II, and personal income in April reached an annual rate of \$244,400,000, a rise of \$1,500,000,000 since March.

Some of the largest department stores in New York and a few other cities then began cutting prices. Department store sales in New York in the week ending June 2 shot up 24 per cent above a year ago.

There is one danger in the big sales, a commerce department analyst said. Supplies of consumer durable goods will be drained by this fall when shortages of raw materials are expected to cut into production, he explained.

5 Firms Request Parking Restrictions

Nine owners asked paving for the 2900 block on Bluff st.

Ground Water Levels Reported at Highs

Ground water levels in Wisconsin were reported generally high in the northern section of the state.

A record high was observed in the key water table well at Eagle River, the U. S. geological survey said Monday in its May summary of the nation's water resources.
