Boasting that it has 16 sponsors sharing the cost of the first commercial color TV program tomorrow, CBS is sparing no expense in beating the drums for the full-hour show at 4:35 which few people will be able to watch because of the lack of color receivers.

The RCA tests will be made on Channel 4 before the start of WJZ-TV's regular black-and-white programs. The experimental and letters KE2XJV will be used, and it's likely that some of the programs will be relayed through NBC's experimental UHF station in Stratford.

Arthur Godfrey heads the list of stars appearing on CBS' first color show tomorrow, with Gary Moore, Ed Sullivan, FCC chairman Wayne Coy, CBS top executive William S. Paley and Frank Stanton, the New York City Ballet, Fay Emerson, Sam Levenson, Robert Alda, Isabel Bigley, the Bill Baird Marionettes and Patsy Painter, "Miss Color" television.

Starts Tuesday, "The World Is Yours," a half-hour color program conducted by Ivan T. Sanderson, naturalist, will be presented Monday through Friday at 4:30 p.m. A half-hour morning program, "Modern Homemakers" starting Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. will be conducted by Edlane Stroh.

Although CBS has high hopes for its color system, which has been stonewalled by the FCC, its critics complain that an unwieldy converter is needed to enable the public to receive the programs and that these will be confined to small screens.

RCA says it has developed a 21-inch color tube which will be demonstrated July 9 when its tri-color tests begin.
