Jewish Leader Hits McCarthy's Accusations
WASHINGTON — (AP) — A Jewish leader told senators Thursday the recent speech of Sen. Joseph McCarthy (R-Wis.) attacking Secretary of Defense James C. Marshall was "vicious, irresponsible."

Rabbi Philip S. Bernstein, Rehober, N. Y., made the statement while testifying before a senate labor committee looking into ways of improving ethical conduct of government officials.

Rabbi Bernstein, president of the Central Conference of American Rabbis said good people must be encouraged to enter and remain in public life. But, he added, "we must surround them with certain safeguards against irresponsible attacks." He continued:

"It is not fair to expect so noble a public servant as Gen. Marshall to desire to remain in public service and continue to endure such vicious irresponsible attacks on his character as Sen. McCarthy recently directed against him," the rabbi said.

Kersten Asks Stronger Anti-Narcotics Program WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Rep. Charles J. Kersten (R-Wis.) introduced a bill Thursday to grant \$988,000 to the bureau of narcotics to hire an additional 132 enforcement officers.

The measure also would provide \$130,000 for the bureau to purchase drugs to be used as evidence in cracking down on peddlers and addicts.

Under present funds, Kersten said, the bureau can afford only 218 agents, or less than five per state this year.

With Kersten's bill, the bureau would have a total of 250 agents.

"The best law cannot be enforced without an adequate number of officers," Kersten said. In some states, he said, there is not a single enforcement agent.

A pauper's purse and a millionaire's tastes turned 46-year-old Harry H. Burton to a criminal career, says the FBI, listing him on its "Ten Most Wanted" roster.

Fingerprints identify Burton as member of a three-man gang which in 1947 held up a party in home of a Los Angeles liquor dealer and shot a guest dead.

The FBI says Burton is a member of the coast's gambling underworld. He is college-educated, a heavy drinker, Burton is 5-foot-10, weighs 190, has small black scars on his face.

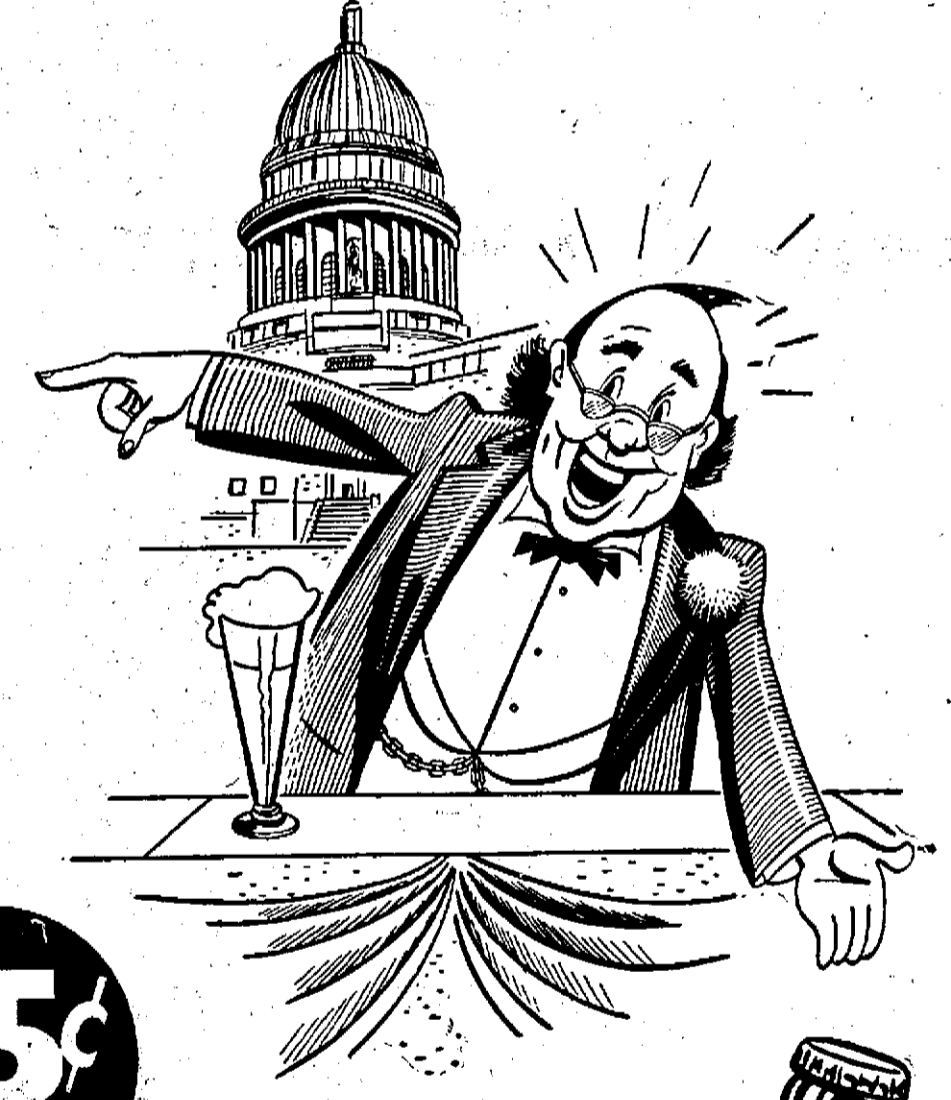
