Kelly Estate to Get New Administrator

EAGLE RIVER - (U.P.) - Vilas County Judge Frank Carter announced Tuesday that he'd name an Eagle River administrator for the summer estate of Chicago's late Mayor Edward J. Kelly.

Carter turned down opposing pe titions by Kelly's widow and Mi-chael Mulcahy, Chicago, co-exe-cutors of Kelly's will and said he'd appoint an Eagle River resident to adminster the estate on Catfish lake near here.

Mulcahy had asked that he and

Mrs. Kelly serve as co-executors of the Wisconsin property, while the widow had asked for two new executors for the summer estate. Neil Conway, head of the inheritance tax division, said he'd go to Eagle River next week to look over the appraisal and determine the amount of taxes due.

This is the month when the supply of fruits and vegetables from state farms and gardens is at its peak, the department said, and the peak production season also means that quality is at its best and prices are "most favorable to those who find it necessary to watch food budgets."


