250,000th DP to Live on Wisconsin Farm

WOODRUFF—(UP)—This small Oneida county farm town will be the home of Volodymyr Holibiv, 250,000th displaced person (DP) to come to this country since the 1948 DP law was passed.
The International Refugee Organization, IRO New York, said it discovered that the 42-year-old Polish farmer was the quarter-millionth DP just before Holibiv, his wife and three daughters boarded ship for the United States at Bremerhaven, Germany. They will live on the Frank Grahl farm near here, where Holibiv will work.
The family, which has had no home since 1943, is expected to disembark at New York July 11.
