HOLLYWOOD. Want an "easy" \$1200? If you're big and husky, and feel that you can pin down Joe Pazzandak in a 30-minute time limit, the money is all yours.

KTLA, in quest for another unusual type program, started this show called "Beat the Champ" a couple of weeks ago, featuring the wrestling ability of Pazzandak, a fellow who would rather wrestle than eat, and who boasts that no one comes too tough for him.

The television station (KTLA) put up an original \$1000, with an additional \$100 per week for every week the champ remains unpinched. All challengers must "beat the champ" and pin him; he does not have to pin them in this time limit. The chance at this jackpot is open to anyone who feels capable of tangling with this 5-foot, 9-inch, 240-pound wrestler. Broadway, Los Angeles.

Joe is a Bohemian lad, holding degrees of art and science from the University of Minnesota, who in his freshman year, wrestled as an amateur, building a long string of amateur titles. In his sophomore year, he turned professional, paying his way through the balance of his college years.

Board Probing Refusal to Sail

TOKYO, July 6. (AP) A board of inquiry met tonight aboard the British transport Empire Meadow to investigate the refusal of the ship's captain to sail to Korea yesterday with a group of Australian troops.

The captain ordered the troops disembarked on the grounds they were drunk and disorderly. He was identified only as Capt. Ravelly.

The troops, with the exception of five witnesses, were flown to Korea today.

Inter-racial Wedlock Held Legal in State

LOS ANGELES, July 6. (AP) Inter-racial marriages, even if contracted in a state which forbids them, are legal in California, Superior Judge Henry M. Willis has ruled.

Judge Willis denied an annulment yesterday to Mrs. Mollie Gregory, described as a member of the Mongolian race, from Woodrow Gregory, a Caucasian. She claimed the marriage was invalid because it was performed in Nevada, which prohibits such marriages. The court said that the California Supreme Court has thrown out a state law barring inter-racial marriages.

Damage to the building was estimated unofficially at \$300,000. A nearby church and a residence were damaged by flying stones.

Grunow, Pioneer Radio Maker, Dies

CHICAGO, July 6. (AP) William C. Grunow, 58, who made and lost a fortune as a pioneer maker of radios, was found dead early today in a 24th-floor room of the Stevens Hotel.

Grunow's body, nude except for a towel draped across the waist, was found lying on the bathroom floor by Dr. Richard P. Ariagno, hotel physician.

The doctor said he was summoned after an unidentified woman telephoned the hotel switchboard and reported:

"A man is having a heart attack in Room 2405."

Dr. Ariagno said he would sign a death certificate attesting that Grunow died of a heart attack. Police Lt. Thomas Donnell said "we are satisfied the death was natural."

Grunow's widow, contacted at her home at Lake Geneva, said her husband suffered a heart attack two years ago and had been under a doctor's care since that time.

Grunow and B. J. Grigsby founded the Grigsby-Grunow Co. in 1927 and began making Majestic radios. By 1929 the men were in the multimillionaire class.

In 1931, Grunow was ousted as president of the firm and the company went bankrupt in 1935.
