No Commercials on BBC

LONDON. (49) The Labor government announced today that radio broadcasting in Britain will remain a state-backed monopoly, without advertising sponsorship, for at least another 15 A white paper issued backed most of the suggestions made

recently by a nonpartisan commission set up by the government. The present charter of the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) expires next Dec. 31. The government's decision differed slightly from the commis-

sion's eeport in that it set a specific term for a new charter, while the commission had suggested indefinite renewal.

The commission also had suggested that the BBC continue to

keep all revenue obtained from licenses which cost each radioowning household in Britain £1 (\$2.80) a year. The government decision was to leave the BBC 85 per cent of this revenue and divert the remainder to the treasury.




