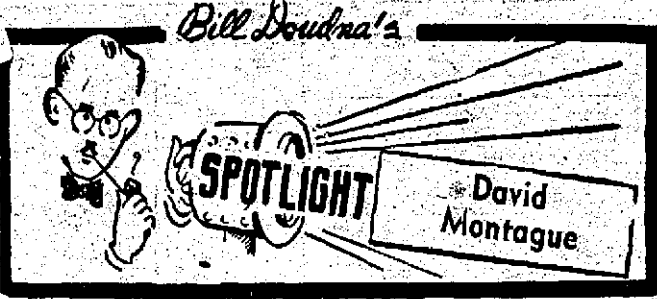

Montague will visit his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Philip Applebaum, 3422 Lake Mendota dr., about two months. Then he will return to Europe.

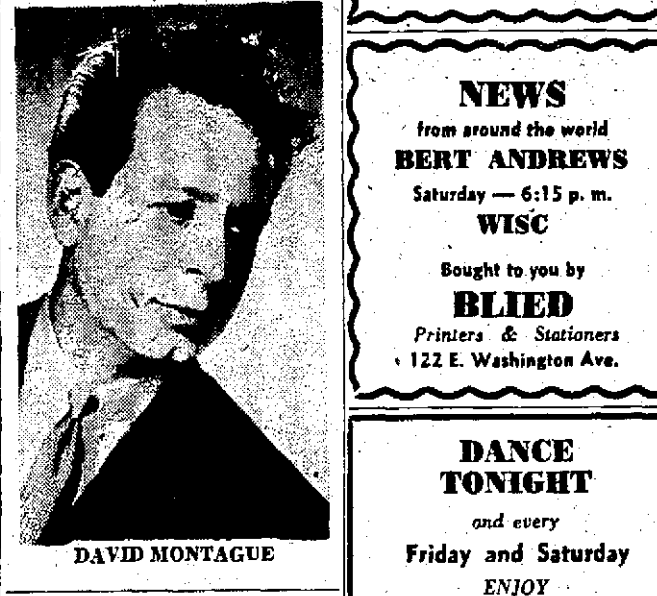
His winter recitals were so successful that he will play return engagements in the capitals of western Europe.

Critics in Paris, Lille, Rome, Geneva, Zurich, Brussels, Amsterdam, The Hague, and London found the young Madison artist "a fine musician," "an appealing player," and possessor of "a great talent."

Said the London Times: "He has sensitivity and dates to show it. Everything he does is justified."

The European tour followed Montague's winning an international contest for young violinists held last October at Geneva, Switzerland.

The violinist was born David Montague Applebaum. At West high school, where he graduated in 1941, he was known as Monty. He studied with Marie Endros

Jackson to Appear for Adverse Questioning Julius Jackson, a Madison bartender who is suing George "Butch" King for \$30,312 for the fatal shooting of his wife two years ago, was ordered Friday afternoon to appear before a court commissioner next Wednesday for adverse questioning by King's attorney.

The examination will be held at 10 a. m. in the office of Court Commissioner Carl Flom, 1 S. Pinckney st.

King's attorney is Darrell McIntyre, who represented him in the murder trial last year which resulted in King being acquitted on insanity grounds for the slaying of Mrs. Sadie Jackson.
