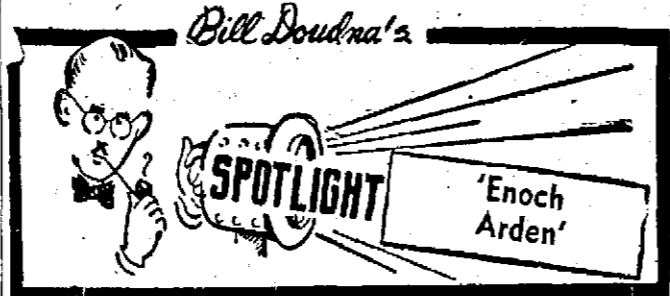

A large audience of Madison townspeople and high school students attending the university's annual music clinic heard an unusual concert in Music hall Wednesday night. It was a performance of the seldom-heard "Enoch Arden" by Richard Strauss, a recitation for voice and piano by Strauss of Tennyson's familiar poem. The original piano work had been arranged for string trio by Walter Heermann. It was played with Heermann as cellist, his brother Emil as violinist, and Leo Steffens as pianist. Richard C. Church was narrator.

There is no reason to find fault with the performance. This talented foursome gave an understanding and adequate reading of the work. However, there is reason to question whether the Strauss music and the Tennyson poem are happily wed. The music, and relatively speaking there is little of it, served only to interrupt the natural presentation of the poetry. It added little to the emotional and melodramatic qualities of the poem and seemed more to be a hindrance to the natural evolution of the story rather than an aid to the many dramatic and emotional climaxes. Actually the work presents itself as "now we have poetry—and now we have music." When the two are to be as one, the listener was conscious of the narrator... having to assume a remarkable slower pace in order to synchronize with music.

It is fortunate that we need not judge Richard Strauss as a composer solely on the basis of the
