N. Y. Policemen Spurn Advice, Apply to Union

NEW YORK, Aug. 4 (AP) Spurning advice of the city administration, 3,000 New York City policemen reportedly have applied to join the CIO Transport Workers Union. The city has 19,000 policemen. Early this year, the CIO union, headed by Michael J. Quill, launched a drive to sign up police, promising them a fight for better pay and other benefits. The campaign drew the denunciation of then Police Commissioner Thomas F. Murphy, who said cops couldn't remain loyal to their trusts and belong to a union. Mayor Vincent Impellitteri also criticized the move. Quill says a charter will be issued the new police union within a month. He said each application contains a no-strike clause.
