Gov. Warren Will Pardon Ex-Convict on TV Report

On his monthly "Report to the People" tonight, Gov. Warren will officially pardon an ex-convict. The event is an exclusive KECA-TV telecast over Channel 7 from 7 to 7:30 p. m.

Gov. Warren will climax his "Report to the People" telecast with his pardoning of an ex-convict who has served five years in San Quentin on a conviction of armed robbery. The ex-convict, who will not be identified on the telecast, has been free on parole for a number of years but has only just recently earned his right to a full pardon which grants him all rights and privileges of American citizenship, otherwise denied those convicted of felonies.

The ex-convict, who will receive the governor's pardon, is a married man and the father of two children. The governor will explain that this man is entitled to a pardon because he has paid his debt to society for his crime and has re-established himself as an honorable citizen in the community. The ex-convict is employed as an automobile repair man.

Gov. Warren will also explain how the California prison system operates, and what is currently being done to improve prison facilities to care for the 11,700 prisoners now in state penal institutions.

The governor will discuss paroles and pardons, and how these are handled by the state's chief executive, and just how an ex-convict earns the right to be restored to society as a respected member.

Answer to Question No. 1. Yes. People who have guilty feelings think that failure acts as a punishment and an abolition for their "sins." Some of them enjoy failure to spite others. Children are experts at this. They often fail in school, get headaches or have accidents. These are unconscious revenge-wishes to get even with their parents. Some husbands and wives practice such devilry on each other and get a lot of fun out of it.

Answer to Question No. 2. No, not unless they get killed or wounded in battle. The total number of our dead, wounded and missing in action in Korea has been terrible and tragic. But, according to the National Safety Council, 15,300 persons were killed on their jobs in 1950, and 75,000 more in auto, airplane, railroad wrecks, fire and home accidents. Over 1,900,000 were disabled on their jobs and all told - 3,900,000 injured. Probably one-half were not "accidents," but due to carelessness or lack of safety devices and training.
