## Admits 'Pay Off' in Arsenal Deal

DETROIT - (UP) - Industrialist Joseph Wiesner said Wednes-day that he paid \$1,900 to an exconvict who was supposed to use the money to "pay off' an official at the army's huge Detroit tank

Wiesner said he gave the money to "five percenter" Wayne Camp-bell with the understanding that it would be paid to "someone" at the arsenal for help in obtaining defense contracts.
Wiesner, owner of the Fairfield

Engineering Co., said he got "several" contracts after giving Campbell the payoff money.


