Answer to Question No. 1

Tito May Deport Jailed Archbishop

ROME, Aug. 13. (AP) Yugoslav Premier Marshal Tito is thinking of deporting imprisoned Archbishop Alojzije Stepinac as the best way out of a ticklish situation, U. S. Sen. Blair Moody (D-Mich.) said last night.

The Senator said when he urged Tito to liberate Stepinac, the premier replied that if he should do so and permit the archbishop to assume his position in the Yugoslav Roman Catholic hierarchy, he (Tito) "would be playing into the hands of Russia." Soviet agents, he said, could use Stepinac's release to split Yugoslavia internally.

Tito said possible solutions of Stepinac's case are deportation or placing the prelate in a monastery.

80 Argentines Held for Sabotage Plot

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, Aug. 13. (AP) Eighty railway men were in jail today on charges of plotting to sabotage train service. Sixty of them will be court-martialed under President Juan D. Peron's decree militarizing the railroads and 20 will be tried under a law protecting the security of the state.

The men are accused of plotting to disrupt services in connection with a work stoppage Aug. 1, when a series of bomb explosions tore up railway tracks and disrupted commuter service.

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LONG MEMORY

Patrolman Arrests Suspect After Year

NEW YORK, Aug. 13. (AP) Mounted Patrolman Henry Leitch, on duty yesterday in Cunningham Park, remembered that almost a year ago an elderly woman picking berries there was badly injured by a man who tried to violate her.

A few moments later, the patrolman spied a man who ducked into the underbrush as soon as he saw the officer. Leitch gave chase and captured him.

Later, the woman, Mrs. Bertha Morzowski, 63, was called to police headquarters and identified the man as the one who had beaten her.

Authorities said he is Green Washington, 33, an ex-convict wanted for larceny. He will be arraigned today on charges of felonious assault and attempted rape, police said.

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
