These days most of the good bridge players in St. Paul are busy polishing up their bidding and playing in preparation for the All-American regional tournament to be held there in the middle of October.

In my opinion some of them are already too slick to need any polishing, as today's hand proves.

When East continued with a low spade, South properly discarded a low diamond. West ruffed with the ten.

Seewald therefore had the advantage of knowing the location of every card as early as the third trick.

West returned a low heart, and dummy won with the queen.

"I am happy to report that Maestro Arturo Toscanini will return to the United States early in September to make some important recordings for RCA Victor and to prepare his programs for his broadcasts with the NBC Symphony orchestra, whose winter season he will open in New York on Nov. 3, at Carnegie hall.

**House Leaders Give Up on Foreign Aid Slash**  
WASHINGTON — (AP) — Administration leaders in the house, it was reported Wednesday, have given up hope of restoring the \$651,250,000 cut out of Pres. Truman's \$8,500,000,000 foreign aid bill.

Instead they are marshaling their forces to prevent Republicans from trimming another \$400,000,000 or more from the big measure.

The house was to have started debate on the bill Wednesday, but other business forced a postponement until today. Passage is slated for Friday or Saturday.

## Vets May Renew Term Policies Each 5 Years, VA Says

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Veterans and servicemen carrying government life insurance term policies can renew their policies every five years indefinitely under a law signed recently by Pres. Truman, the Veterans Administration (VA) said Wednesday.

Previously, term insurance did not carry the automatic right of renewal but congress has nevertheless passed numerous laws extending term insurance policies for those who wanted to keep them in force.

The new law simply takes the burden off congress of passing a law every few years.

The VA said no physical examination is required under the new law, but a policyholder must file for renewal before expiration of his policy. The regulations apply to both U. S. government life insurance of World War I and National Service Life Insurance of World War II.

The VA does not favor term insurance, however, because a policyholder must pay the premium rate of his age when he renews the policy and thus term insurance becomes expensive in later years.

"For this reason," a spokesman said, "VA recommends early conversion to a permanent plan of insurance, for which the premium remains the same for the life of the contract."
