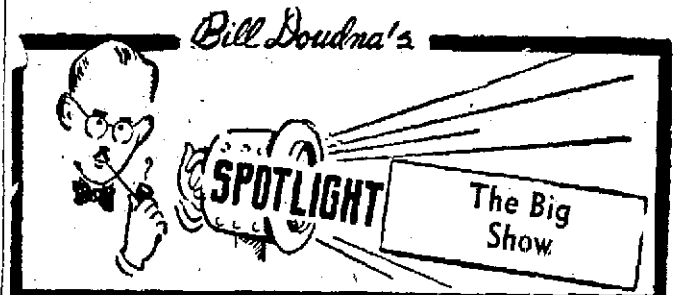

Feeds Production Hit All-Time High in '51

The feed industry in this country has been producing live stock and poultry feeds at an all-time record level this year. Walter C. Berger, president of the American Feed Manufacturers Assn., told a group of feed men meeting at the University of Wisconsin campus in a two-day session.

The first two broadcasts of the 1951-52 season of NBC's 90-minute radio extravaganza, "The Big Show," will originate from London and Paris.

The performers will be preceded by a full staff of NBC production personnel headed by producer Dee Engelbach and including conductor Meredith Willson and writers Goodman Ace, Mort Green, George Foster, and Selma Diamond.

An unprecedented "show train" originating in the South, with special sections from Memphis, Birmingham, Chattanooga, Nashville, New Orleans, and Atlanta, will take several hundred passengers to the Oct. 14 broadcast of "The Big Show" in New York City.
