



Wash mint; place in saucepan. Crush thoroughly with a wooden masher or a glass. Add apple juice and pectin. Place over high heat; bring quickly to a boil. Remove from heat; even high neat; bring quickly to a boll. Remove from near; cover; let stand 10 minutes. Strain through a fine sieve or double thickness of cheese-cloth into large saucepan. Place saucepan holding juice over high heat. Stir in sugar, Bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard 1 minute, stirring con-

stantly. Remove from heat; add green coloring to give desired shade. Skim off foam with metal spoon; pour quickly into glasses. Cover jelly at once with ½-inch hot paraffin.
