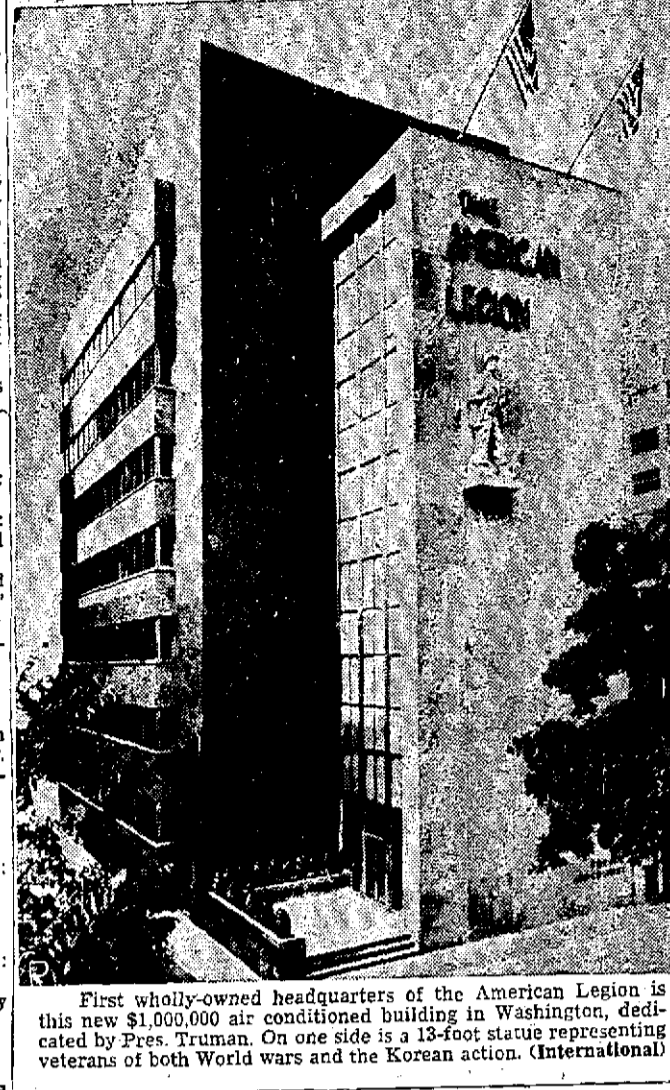

A bill introduced in the U. S. senate this week to give Wisconsin title to 66,376 acres of federal land it has on lease had state officials in Madison pushing Friday over what land is involved.

H. T. J. Cramer, assistant director of the conservation department, said it might be either the Necadawd wildlife refuge in Monroe and Juneau counties, or a forest tract in Jackson county.

Czech Protest Gets Hot Reply

WASHINGTON — (UP) — The United States rejected Czechoslovakia's protest of the propaganda broadcasts of Radio Free Europe.

The note was made public as government attorneys sought a legal way to carry out the congressional recommendation for a total boycott on trade with Czechoslovakia until Oatis is released.

Oatis, Associated Press bureau chief in Prague, was sentenced to 10 years in prison by a Communist court which convicted him of "espionage" on evidence which showed that he performed only 1 1/2 routine duties of a foreign correspondent.

The state department will not endorse candidates, but will continue to take part in the "Citizens Non-Partisan Conference on Political Education," which it helped found.

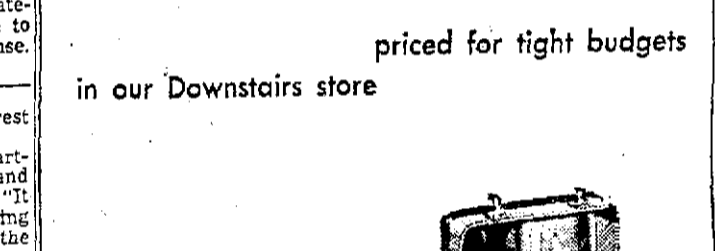
The delegates turned down a proposal to double the present 1-cent levy for political action on each member and voted to continue the existing assessment, which is monthly.

The state department told the Czechs that they had a lot of nerve complaining about "legitimate criticisms" from Radio Free Europe when the Czech press and radio indulged freely in hostile and vituperative attacks against the United States.
