## Anti-Aircraft Troops

**'Guard' Chicago Today**  
CHICAGO (UP) — Army anti-aircraft troops with full equipment will move into Chicago today for a two-day training exercise in air defense.  
The army said one phase of the exercise would be the hauling in of anti-aircraft guns and placing them in and about the city. The emplacements will be ringed with barbed wire and placed under guard.  
Heavy equipment will be moved during periods of light traffic in order not to interfere with civilian traffic, the army said.  
It refused to name units which will participate or say what their strength would be, but said the exercise also was designed to test the movement of "units of battalion or larger size" through populated areas.

## 60 Billion Arms Bill Appropriations Set to Get Action

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two bills carrying more than \$60,000,000 for the nation's fighting forces may make considerable progress in senate committees this week.  
Chairman Richard Russell (D-Ga.) called for a billion-dollar-a-day pace from his armed services committee in its consideration of a \$5,780,000,000 military construction bill. He hoped to complete testimony this week and have the measure ready for senate action.  
It is an authorization for hundreds of projects—many of them super secret—asked by the army, navy, and air force as they expand to a permanent basis of 3,500,000 persons on active duty.  
Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) expected to wind up closed-door hearings on a record-breaking peacetime appropriation bill for the defense agencies during the week. He heads an appropriations subcommittee handling military funds.  
The bill contained \$56,500,000 as it passed the house.  
Both bills are on the "must list" for action before the congress can hope to wind up the present long session.  
The construction bill provides for a ring of air bases in this country and other parts of the world intended to match the expanding air power of Soviet Russia and her satellites.

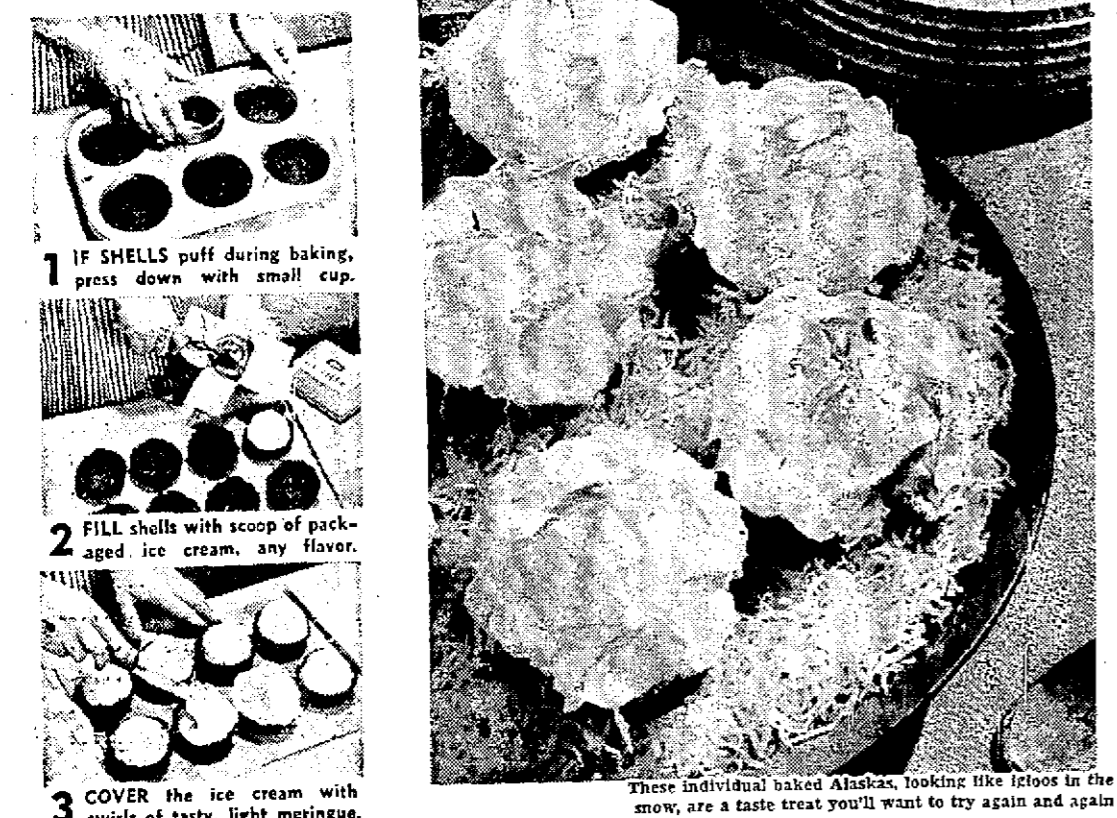

## ALASKA IGLOOS

You'll find that this wonderful new recipe is easy to make—and as delicious as it looks. It consists of little chocolate cups of ice cream hidden under deep meringue, broiled for a few seconds. You can make the cups the day before, or in the morning, and whip up the meringue at the last minute, just before serving.

**ALASKA IGLOOS**  
(Makes 8 servings)  
Base:  
1/2 cup butter  
2 squares chocolate  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup brown sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 qt. pre-packaged ice cream  
Meringue:  
4 egg whites  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla  
Melt butter and chocolate in double boiler. Remove from heat. Mix together salt, sugar, flour and rolled oats; blend into melted butter and chocolate mixture. Add vanilla. Pack into eight greased large muffin cups, covering the bottom and extending one-half inch up onto the sides. Bake in a moderate oven, 375 degrees F. about 12 minutes. Cool; remove from pans. Place on a small baking sheet covered with heavy paper. To prepare the meringue, add salt to egg whites. Beat until frothy. Add sugar a tablespoon at a time, beating after each addition. Add vanilla and continue beating until mixture stands in lustrous peaks. Fill each chocolate cup with a generous scoop of ice cream. Spread meringue over top and sides completely covering the ice cream. Place 4 inches below broiler heat for a few seconds to brown meringue. Serve immediately.
