Live TV Shows Have Problems

HOLLYWOOD. Then there was the actor who rehearsed a television program for six days. Nights, he was appearing in a play. Finally the TV show went on the air.

A dog licked his face when it wasn't supposed to. He dragged it down out of camera range, and it started barking. The camera pulled back on cue and showed the actor trying to restrain the dog's bark.

Dana Andrews related the episode while arguing that television drama must be on film, to eliminate fluffs and fiascos. The actor got \$1500 for the show, he said, but spent \$800 restoring his shattered nerves in a hospital.

Andrews, presently busy in "I Want You," is one of many stars who haven't appeared on television. Their movie contracts won't let them. He owns a receiver, but said: "I don't look at it; the programs are so awful. As somebody said, it's compelling, but it's bad. Still, anybody who has eyes in his head knows that television has got to be."

Viewers will have to pay, by some means, for good shows. "I've never gotten much for nothing; I don't see how people can expect to get top-grade entertainment in their homes for nothing. Producers won't have to cut costs. They can spend even more than they do for theater pictures. Say there's a charge of \$1 per set for a show and five people see it—20 cents apiece. A major picture could gross \$1,500,000 in one night's showing."

But theaters must go be eliminated, he feels. Three-dimensional pictures are one answer for them. He's thinking of investing in one method whereby "you live with the people on the screen."

"And theaters must go for more exploitation. Too many of them leave it up to the producers. Car dealers don't operate that way. They advertise so that when you think of a brand of car you think of the man who sells it."

What happens on live TV, Dana asked, when actors forget their lines? "Now they cut the sound off and the prompter throws the line. Can you imagine 2,000,000 people getting up and walking over to their sets, thinking 'What the matter with it?'"

Another argument for filmed TV is that movie cameras can utilize most of the world for settings. "Why limit your show to a stage—when it can take in all outdoors?"

Q. Does English law prohibit the marriage of a king to a commoner? A. Contrary to a common but erroneous impression, the law leaves the king entirely free to marry anyone he wishes, whatever her race, nationality or position in society, with one reservation. By the Bill of Rights passed in 1689 the sovereign is excluded from the throne if he becomes a Roman Catholic or if he marries a Roman Catholic. In the event of a sovereign seeking marriage with a divorced woman a serious issue might arise, as the hierarchy of the Anglican Church hardly could be required to celebrate a marriage if there were held to be objections on canonical grounds.
