Jerry Colonna's Career Began With Boys' Choir

HOLLYWOOD. It is not one of the more widely known facts of Jerry Colonna's life—not even his friend Bob Hope knows it—but Jerry is an exile from a boys' choir, from St. Mary's boys' choir in Boston. Father Kelley, long since gone to the reward due priests with a talent for music criticism, heard Colonna when he made his first public appearance at the age of 10.

Colonna, who is now appearing in his own television show from KECA-TV Wednesday nights at 10, found it in his generous Italian heart to forgive his first pastor for this quick, sharp judgment. Looking back through the years, he realizes that he was even more unappreciative of his own genius at the time.

Colonna has looked at life from many angles and enlivens his show with anecdotes there-of. It amuses him that a new generation of viewers include many who are surprised that he can play the trombone like a virtuoso. As a matter of fact there was a time when he and Tommy Dorsey had a monopoly on the trombone business in New York.

Like any young man with a horn, he deemed this with good life and planned to stay with it always. He might have, too, had it not been for Minerva Plus, who played Mrs. Nussbaum on Fred Allen's radio show. She brought him to Allen's attention, an audition followed, which led to the
